## A CONTEMPORARY IDENTITY

A benchmark hospital of regional importance, perfectly situated at the crossroads of three major highways, CHSF Regional Hospital is a coherent complex comprising 1,000 hospital beds in four separate clinics.

The architectural decision was made to arrange the facility in layers over six levels in order to provide flexibility and upgradability, resulting in a modular layout around large internal courtyards, which offer great transparency and natural light. Protected from pollution, and displaying a linear, kinetic appearance along the outer ring road to the South, the architecture takes a domestic turn to the North, with broad views of a leafy urban park; the accommodation blocks stretch in this direction, seemingly suspended over the garden paths which criss-cross the site.
