Fine Arts Museum, Grenoble

The museum's design is based on the use of indirect natural light from above and features spaces laid out on a single level, rooms designed to highlight the works on display, a continuous path through the museum and a

close relationship between the indoor volumes and the building's openings towards the city and landscape. It is surrounded by a two hectare garden, an open air museum featuring monumental sculptures by contemporary artists.
